The film is the newly created Innakonigewin Andaadad Aki:Michi Sagging Treaties produced by Curve Lake First Nation. This will be followed by a talk, featuring Trent Indigenous Studies lecturer and PH.D. Candidate, Phil Abbott. Phil's research explores the impacts of early European settlement in Mississauga territory. Treaty 20, 1818, is also a focus of Phil's work. He is interested in how this history has been ignored and distorted and how this impacts Indigenous/non-Indigenous relations today.

### **DID YOU KNOW?**

In the United States, Super Bowl Sunday is the second biggest eating day of the year - after Thanksgiving.

According to the World Health Organization, at least one-third of all cancer cases are preventable.

Ashes symbolize the dust that we eventually become after our death. This is a reminder for us of our mortality and that our time on earth is limited.

Sundays are excluded in the 40 days of Lent, as they are considered a celebratory day that represents the resurrection of Jesus and the Sabbath day of rest.

Canada's red and white maple leaf flag is one of the most recognizable flags in the world.

There are over 9.3 million families in Canada, 38% of which live in the province of Ontario: 2011 Census.

It is estimated that there are over 7,000 different languages spoken in the world, of which more than 50% are likely to die out within the next few generations.

The first person of African heritage to come to what is now Canada arrived some 400 years ago. In 1604, Mathieu Da Costa arrived with the French explorers Pierre Du Gua De Monts and Samuel de Champlain. Da Costa, a multilingual interpreter who spoke English, French, Dutch, Portuguese, and Pidgin Basque, provided an invaluable link with the Mik'maq people encountered by the Europeans.
