DID YOU KNOW?

In France, it is customary to give a sweet smelling flower called the spring of lily of the valley (a symbol of springtime) on May 1st. The tradition started in 1561 when King Charles IX of France received a lily of the valley as a lucky charm.

Ascension is the 40th day after Easter, celebrated on the sixth Sunday of the Easter season in Protestant churches.

An ancient custom in England, called the Beating of the Bounds, is often performed on or near Ascension.

Red is the color of Pentecost. The color comes from the flame that scripture says appeared above the heads of each of the disciples (Acts 2:3).

Victoria Day was originally declared a celebration in 1854, making it Canada's oldest state holiday

Theologically, the Trinity is a common thread amongst most Christian faiths. Trinity Sunday falls on the Sunday following Pentecost. The Trinity does not explicitly appear in the Bible.
